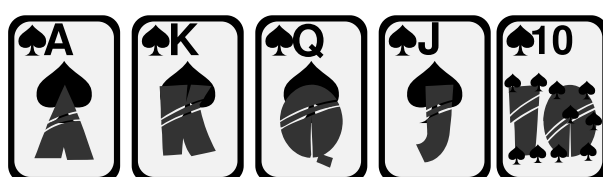


POKER HANDS RANKINGS

1 ROYAL FLUSH



The highest possible hand, A-K-Q-J-10 of the same suit.

Good to know: Unbeatable hand. Bet and raise to maximize value, but consider slow-playing if the opponents play aggressively.

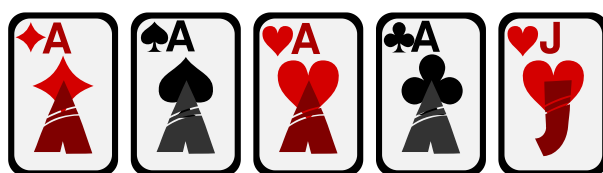
2 STRAIGHT FLUSH



Five consecutive cards of the same suit.

Good to know: Extremely strong hand. A similar strategy to the Royal Flush hand. Play aggressively, go for max value.

3 FOUR OF A KIND



Four cards of the same rank.

Good to know: Very strong; bet aggressively. Rarely beatable hand.

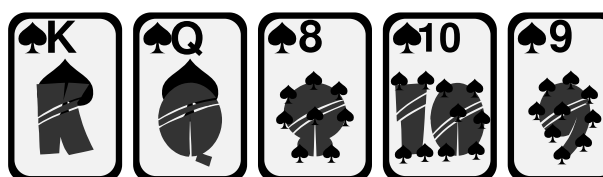
4 FULL HOUSE



Three of a kind and a pair.

Good to know: Strong hand. Bet for value, you will often face a stronger full house.

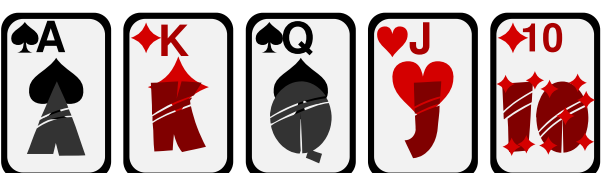
5 FLUSH



Any five cards of the same suit (in any order).

Good to know: Strong but often beaten by higher flushes. Bet, but fold to heavy action if higher cards of the same suit are on the board.

6 STRAIGHT



Five consecutive cards of different suits.

Good to know: Solid hand. Bet and call, but be cautious of higher straights and often flushes.

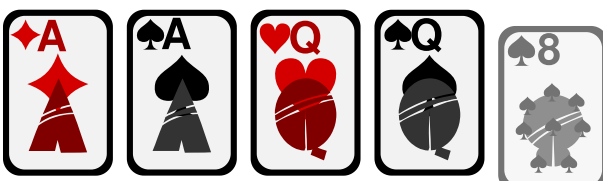
7 THREE OF A KIND



Three cards of the same rank.

Good to know: Good hand to trap your opponents, but watch out for full houses.

8 TWO PAIR



Two different pairs of cards.

Good to know: Decent hand. Bet moderately, but be ready to fold if faced with strong betting action. You will often lose against trips with this hand.

9 ONE PAIR



Two cards of the same rank.

Good to know: A common hand. Play cautiously, especially in big pots or against multiple opponents

10 HIGH CARD



None of the above hands; the highest card plays.

Good to know: Weak hand - let the pros win with this kind of hands.
